Maybe you've seen protests in the news and wondered what they're really all about. Whatever reason you picked up this book, vou're here because you want to make a difference and change things for the better, and that's awesome! There's a lot to learn about race and racism. But don't be overwhelmed-we'll take it step by step. First learn the language and concepts of race and racism. Then we can start to think about what changes we can make in ourselves, in our communities, and in the world that can help stop racism. There are lots of ideas in this book for thinking bigger and learning new skills as we work to end racism all around us. Imagine a world where everyone is treated fairly and no one is hurt or looked down on because of the color of their skin.
