AND "THE KISS AND THE MOONSHINE," REVEAL THE CLASH OF DIFFERENT CULTURAL APPROACHES. ALL SHOW THE WARM-HEARTEDNESS AND GOOD WILL OF THE OJIBWAY INDIANS. IF THEY ARE GENTLY SATIRIZED, SO ARE THE WHITES WHO WOULD CHANGE THEM, AND WITH GOOD REASON.
