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Provisioning Paris - Steven Laurence Kaplan 2018-09-05
Dependence upon grain deeply marked every aspect of life in eighteenth-

century France. Steven Kaplan focuses upon this dependence at the point where it placed the greatest strain on the state, the society, and the

individual—on the daily supply of grain and flour that furnished the staff of life. He reconstructs the history of provisioning in pre-industrial Paris and provides a comprehensive view of a culture shaped by the subsistence imperative. Who were the agents of the provisioning trade? What were their commercial practices? What sorts of relations did they maintain with each other? How did the authorities regulate their business? To answer these questions, Professor Kaplan combed the archives and libraries of France. He maps out the elementary structures of the trade and shows how they were transformed as a result of cultural and political as well as commercial and technological changes. In rich ethnographic detail he evokes the day-to-day life of merchants,

millers, bakers, brokers, and market officials. He shows how flour superseded grain and how the millers overtook the merchants in the provisioning process. He explores the tension between the suppliers' need for freedom and the consumers' need for security. Even as he weaves the intricate patterns of life inside and outside the marketplace he never loses sight of the immense interests at stake: the stability and legitimacy of the government, the durability of the social structure, and the survival of the people.

Història agrària dels Països Catalans

Els capítols d'aquest volum de la Història Agrària dels Països Catalans dels segles moderns se centren tant en l'observació de les continuïtats com en la identificació dels canvis. S'hi examinen les conjuntures seculares, les transformacions dels conreus i de les tècniques (amb atenció especial a la vinya i el vi) i les estructures socials. Els autors distingeixen tres conjuntures en el transcurs dels segles XVI al XVIII. A finals del XV i inicis del XVI s'identifica un moviment expansiu en termes demogràfics i productius que es prolonga fins al final de la

dècada del 1580. Els guanys vegetatius de la població, encavalcats amb l'ajut decisiu de la immigració, col·laboren en la reconstrucció de les bases agràries d'una producció en què la rotació biennal i els cereals són arreu encara hegemònics i les novetats socials i productives escasses. El període 1580-1680 és reconegut com una fase històrica ambivalent en què la crisi es combina amb les transformacions. Els canvis en les estructures socials precediren les novetats agràries i les diferències entre els territoris catalans rau en bona part en el distint paper que la noblesa o els sectors urbans tenen en les relacions socials agràries, en les quals la pagesia tendeix a erosionar la renda feudal. Arreu, però, l'endeutament per raons

privades o fiscals engendra diferenciació social. El segle XVIII es veu com el segle de l'expansió i la formació del mercat, però també com la culminació i final d'un model de creixement. A Catalunya permeté la formació de xarxes protoindustrials i al País Valencià la formació d'una agricultura intensiva totalment comercialitzada.

The outbreaks and collective violence arising from the tensions existing within society have long been themes in the study of British social history. This book, first published in 1983, attempts to survey the whole range of these rural riots, to compare and contrast them, and to draw general conclusions. Seventy-five maps are included in this volume, each with an accompanying commentary written by an authority on the particular subject. Taken together, the maps show how the

distribution of protest changed over time, how particular forms of protest – riots connected with land, with food and with labour – altered as Britain developed from a predominantly feudal to a prominently capitalist society. This title will be of interest to students of history.

Irrigation and Society in Medieval Valencia - Thomas F. Glick 1970

Of the communal institutions elaborated by medieval Spaniards, the most significant and longest-lived were the irrigation communities which the Muslims had established centuries earlier in the Valencian region. The objective of these remarkably democratic communities was justice and equity in water distribution; and the irrigators succeeded in combining traditional rules with consensual authority to maintain their systems with a minimum of conflict. Above the community level, however, regional powers including king, nobles, church, and town all sought to derive, at each other's expense, the

maximum benefit from the available water supply. The resultant interplay of power politics was a sharp contrast to the democracy of the communities. Thomas F. Glick has drawn on original documents of the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries to present in this volume a thorough and lively study of Valencian irrigation and society. In Part One Glick describes medieval Valencian irrigation in the epoch of its fullest documentation (1238-4500), focusing on the institutional dynamics of both the local irrigation communities--those irrigating from a single main canal--and the larger regional units, the huertas. He examines the huerta environment and the administration of the irrigation communities and then discusses intracommunity conflict, the city's

role in irrigation development, the search for new sources of water, and regional arrangements for irrigation. Part Two is concerned generally with the spread of Islamic irrigation technology and, more specifically, with cultural diffusion and the persistence of cultural forms during the transition in Spain from Islamic to Christian rule. Here the author examines the antecedents of medieval Valencian irrigation on the basis of Islamic survivals in medieval Christian institutions and of comparative data from other Islamic irrigation systems. He also touches on aspects of acculturation and cultural transition that extend beyond the geographical and temporal bounds of this study, explaining that "the history of Spanish irrigation is but one example of the administrative

Colombia's status as the fourth largest nation in Latin America and third most populous—as well as its largest exporter of such disparate commodities as emeralds, books, processed cocaine, and cut flowers—makes this, the first history of Colombia written in English, a much-needed book. It tells the remarkable story of a country that has consistently defied modern Latin American stereotypes—a country where military dictators are virtually unknown, where the political left is congenitally weak, and where urbanization and industrialization
