By 1800, the success of London's water industry made it a model for other cities in Europe and beyond as

they began to build their own water networks. The city's water infrastructure even inspired builders of other large-scale urban projects, including gas and sewage supply networks. *The History of the London Water Industry, 1580–1820* explores the technological, cultural, and mercantile factors that created and sustained this remarkable industry.

Tomory examines how the joint-stock form became popular with water companies, providing a stable legal structure that allowed for expansion. He also explains how the roots of the London water industry's divergence from the Continent and even from other British cities was rooted both in the size of London as a market and in the late seventeenth-century consumer revolution. This fascinating and unique study of essential utilities in the early modern period will interest business historians and historians of science and technology alike.
