While many doctors claim that Lyme disease—a tick-borne bacterial infection—is easily diagnosed and treated, other doctors and the patients they care for argue that it can persist beyond standard antibiotic treatment in

the form of chronic Lyme disease. In *Divided Bodies*, Abigail A. Doctorow—Falkoff traces the fraught materialities of the present to cluttered spaces of modernity: bibliomaniacs' libraries, flea markets, crime scenes, dust-heaps, and digital archives. *Possessed* shows how the figure of the hoarder has come to personify the economic, epistemological, and ecological conditions of
