Sing Joy to All the World! - 2017-09

"We gather to tell the story of Emmanuel, God With Us! We gather to remember this story, to wait, and watch for Him to come again--even now. Come, Lord Jesus!" The overriding theme of this inspiring Christmas work by Lloyd Larson is joy. It celebrates the promise that joy comes to those who wait, that following the long dark night, the breaking of dawn brings joy for the new day. The Old Testament tells of God's promise to Israel, which was fulfilled in the coming of the Messiah to the remote village of Bethlehem. As recipients of that joy, it becomes the privilege and responsibility of all who have experienced it to share the good news: "Sing Joy to All the World!" The music incorporates original melodies with familiar carols in a work that ranges from contemplative to celebratory. It can be performed effectively with piano and choir alone or with Ed Hogan's impactful orchestration. Kylee Larson's scripturally based

narrative may incorporate two narrators, and SATB and SAB editions ensure that choirs large and small can enjoy this moving work.

However, traditional rounds are often too wide of a range for the changing voice, hence this collection was created with the young male voice in mind. Easy-to-sing ostinatos for the changing male voice accompany 10 familiar rounds sung by treble voices. Each round is presented in two keys to accommodate both the cambiata, mid-voice and new baritone range comfortably. Experiment with other keys until you find your choirs' "sweet spot" vocally. This will give you a good idea of the

range and tessitura that will be effective when choosing your choral literature. These unaccompanied rounds may be taught entirely by ear, or duplicated for sight reading purposes. The songbook is also available in English. The CD comes in an English and accompaniment track version so you can sing along in any language, or listen as an instrumental CD. This beautifully bound volume is a must have for every Christmas music collection. The cover features the endearing Greg Olsen's painting, "Spirit of Christmas," making this a true holiday treasure. Composer Cathy Neff has put together a Christmas feast with songs that are all centered on Christ. This is Christmas like you've never heard it before! With new arrangements of old favorites, and some soon-to-be new favorites in styles from pop to classical, country to jazz, this album has something for everyone. "Let Him In" is a powerful ballad that reflects on the question: "If the Baby Jesus came today, would you make Him room in your inn?" Piano, vocal, and guitar. "Angels We Have Heard on High" arranged for choir with piano and organ. A must have for your choir, or your family! You don't want to miss "Don't X Out My Christmas!" A rollicking country romp through the Christmas season with only one request: don't remove Christ from my Christmas. Lead sheet with vocals and chords. "O Come Emmanuel-What Child" is a medley of two Christmas favorites: "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" and "What Child Is This?" arranged for a solo instrument and piano or harp. Very versatile arrangement. "Where Was the Rest of the World" is a heartwarming ballad for solo voice and piano and guitar. It begs the question: If the only ones who were aware of the Christ Child's birth were a few shepherds in the fields, where was the rest of the world and why didn't they realize that He had been born? Better yet, where are they today as we celebrate His birth? "Christmastime" is just as cute as it comes. A light, very fun look at everything that is wonderful about Christmas that makes it our favorite time of year, especially the Baby Jesus. "Lullaby, Dear Child" is another touching ballad beautifully arranged as a solo or duet. We tiptoe in to hear Mary, singing the Christ Child to sleep. "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing" is a powerful arrangement of this favorite carol. Contains SATB choir parts and piano

accompaniment, with a reduction of the string parts found in the original arrangement. Easily played on an organ or assimilated into the piano part. You might never want to use another arrangement ever again! "When You Wake" is a heart melting lullaby as a parent puts their child to bed on Christmas Eve. All the tenderness of the season rolled into one melody. This will become one of your standards. "Three Ships" is a mixed-meter jazz rendition of "I Saw Three Ships." This is a jazz chart, or lead sheet, with melody, chords and rhythms for jazz players. Have fun with this one! "Christmas Eve" is a thoughtful look at the wisemen's visit and the gifts they brought, and what we could possibly give the Savior this Christmas. This arrangement of "Away in a Manger" utilizes all three of the most popular tunes for this song, one for each verse. Cathy Neff has added a fourth verse that brings the song to present day. A must have edition of this beloved carol. It is Cathy Neff's belief that music is not meant to be a spectator sport. That is why she has made this book available. Grab your guitar, sit around your piano, and sing! After all, it's Christmas!
